stories which are completely new for some people who attend. Can you imagine being 50+ years old and never before hearing the stories of Adam and Eve or Noah and the ark? Please pray with us that these dear friends will trust in Christ and be firmly established in the truth of God’s word.

Another door more recently opened up to us in the village of Khilek Luang, a community located about 30 minutes from where Grace Church meets. Allen Radtke, a Christian from the United States, and his wife Mareewan, a Thai believer, attend Grace Church and live in Khilek Luang. In fact, Mareewan grew up in that village and the two of them have been serving there together since they were married five years ago, all the while praying that one day a church could be started in that place. Aside from Allen and Mareewan, there are only a handful of Christians in the community. In March my family began partnering with the Radtkes and started House of Grace (Baan Prakhun), an outreach ministry that meets for a couple hours every Sunday afternoon in the Radtke's home. Several children attend this meeting each week so we are conducting a youth program which includes games, singing, telling Bible stories, and eating a meal together. Following these meetings, we typically visit people in the community with the goal of building friendships and sharing the gospel. In addition to leading these weekly activities, we also held a large outreach event at the beginning of June for the entire village. Although we were forced to change our meeting location at the last minute, we praise the Lord that there were still over 50 people who attended this event and heard the gospel. In addition to singing and giving out door prizes, we showed a Thai movie that told the story of a local farming family and their journey to faith in Christ. Please pray for the children and families who are being reached through House of Grace. Pray they will respond to the gospel and believe in Christ. Most people in Khilek Luang have very little knowledge of the Bible and so everything we're sharing is quite new to them. Also, please pray for Allen and Mareewan as they carry on this ministry alone after we go on home assignment this month.

At the end of May our family attended the 3rd Southeast Asia Grace Conference (SEAGC) in Siem Reap, Cambodia. It was a unique time to meet with other believers, including fellow TCM missionaries, national, and local church leaders. Over 160 people from 11 countries spent several days exploring the theme *When Mission Gets Real: SENT* in effort to encourage and pray for one another, worship together, and develop ideas for the future ministry of TCM in Southeast Asia. In 2018 the 4th SEAGC will be held in Chiang Mai, Thailand! Please pray as we help plan for this important event.

Following the SEAGC we had the honor of hosting the 13 member Asia Adventure team with people from the U.S. and England. Led by Jessica's parents, Tim and Judy Heath, this group first visited Malaysia and Cambodia, where they attended the SEAGC, before arriving in

Thailand. For five days we helped guide this team on several outings and ministry events, exposing them to both Thai culture and the ministries of TCM Thailand. It was encouraging for us and a great opportunity for them to see the different ministries first hand.

We'll be leaving Thailand for home assignment this month. We will travel to the States on August 11th and plan to stay for about 11 months. It's been over 3 years since we were last in the U.S. and so we're very thankful for the opportunity to visit and share with churches and ministry partners as well as spend time with family. Our children will homeschool via an online program which will give us some flexibility to travel as a family. At the same time, our plan is for Jessica and the children to remain more stationary while I (Nathan) do more of the traveling and sharing.
