The 4 of us are doing great. We survived winter with very minimal health issues-much better than previous winters. Sheba celebrated her 41st birthday June 24, and Shedea turned 10 on July 28. Shedea will finish Grade 3 in December. Shedesh has 4 books left to finish Kinder 2. They are growing fast! Monday is our day off.

YouthGIG Day Conference

June 17 - Youth Growing in Grace (YouthGiG) was officially launched with its 1st conference held at Grace Outreach Church - Boksburg a day after South Africa's June 16 National Youth Day celebration. There were 70 delegates including adult volunteers and kids from three congregations. Certified John Maxwell speaker and Bible school graduate, Josephine Chalmers, did a workshop on Personal Character. Dean spoke on the theme, Youth Growing In Grace. While grateful for the good turn-out, still there were youths from other church branches that didn't make it due to work and financial issues.





Ministerial Advancement Program

June 15 - Grace Theological Education And Ministry School (G-TEAMS) added a 3rd level to its program. Ministerial Advancement Program (MAP) is a course designed to provide practical knowledge and guidance for pastors and previous graduates. Classes are done every second Saturday of the month. Subjects include: Leadership, Public Speaking, Personal Development, Inter-Personal Relationship, Counseling, The How To's of Bible Studies and Church Planting.

KidsGiG Teachers Training

June 29 – We conducted a workshop for the 1st batch of KidsGiG teachers from different Grace Outreach Church branches. KidsGiG (Kids Growing in Grace) is our ministry for children

ages 3 to 12. The priority is Sunday school classes, but we are developing it to be KidsGiG-3D-Club during school holidays later on. Thanks to Bible Doctrines To Live By for generously providing us the curriculum.



Bible Study Meetings

Aside from preaching at Grace Outreach Churches on Sundays and teaching at G-TEAMS on Saturdays, we also teach weekly Bible study groups. The meetings are Tuesday to Friday evenings in 6 strategic locations identified for church planting. The hosts invite families and friends, both believers and non-believers, for 1 hour Bible teaching and interactions. These meetings are intended not only for Bible knowledge impartation, but also to establish closer relationships with people, in hopes of building a desire to start their own church in due time.





August 4 - Grace Outreach Ministries South Africa (GOMSA) held its launching joint service. More than 200 adults and children packed the hall of New Millennium College in Kempton Park. Message from the Word through Dean, reiteration of vision and mission from board chairman Goodman Ndou. orientation of plans and presentation of programs, national leadership and distribution of membership/ church affiliation/workers certificates were highlights of the event. GOMSA is the national counterpart of Things to Come Mission in South Africa.
